# Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations

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
#### Introduction

- The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) is a specialized agency of the United Nations that leads international efforts to defeat hunger.
- It was established on Oct.16,1945 and its HQ is at Rome. It is the oldest existing agency of U.N. There are 194 member nations and one organization ( European Union)are affiliate to this agency.
- Its goal is to achieve food security for all and make sure that people have regular access to enough high-quality food to lead active, healthy lives. With over 194 member states, FAO works in over 130 countries worldwide. It believes that everyone can play a part in ending hunger.

### Structure

- FAO is headed by a Director- General.
- Conference, Council, Regional Conferences and Committees are other supporting machinery.
- As per the Constitution of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, which provides for "a Conference of the Organization in which each Member Nation and Associate Member shall be represented by one delegate".
- FAO has 194 Member Nations plus one Member Organization, the European Union and two Associate Members, The Faroe Islands and Tokelau.
