- Purpose:
- * To provide specification for authority and reference entries
 - * Specification for names & uniform titles
 - * To share machine-readable forms/data
 - * To clarify the association of persons/entities
 - * Uniformity in access
 - * Authorized heading & References
 - * Define set of ~~elements~~ in the entry.

* Scope: All published material, microprint, machine-readable, forms for cataloguing and bibliographies

* Structure:

1. Authority records & displays
2. Authorized heading area
3. Information note
4. See reference tracing area
5. See also reference tracing area
6. cataloguer's note
7. Source area
8. International standard authority data name area (ISADN)
