Introduction

Enumerative bibliography is considered as a one of the feminist tools. According to the Bibliographical Society of America (BSA), enumerative bibliography is¹:

the listing of books according to some system or reference plan, for example, by author, by subject, or by date. The implication is that the listings will be short, usually providing only the author's name, the book's title, and date and place of publication. Enumerative bibliography (sometimes called systematic bibliography) attempts to record and list, rather than to describe minutely. Little or no information is likely to be provided about physical aspects of the book such as paper, type, illustrations, or binding. A library's card catalogue is an example of an enumerative bibliography, and so is the list at the back of a book of works consulted...

In Mohanlal Sukhadia University, despite significant work in the field, there is no narrative, no central theses or a list that join together the diverse body of work on Women/ Feminism/ Gender questions/ issues. In response to that, UGC Centre for Women's Studies, Mohanlal Sukhadia University, Udaipur, began to gather data in the form of secondary source citations in enumerative bibliography consolidating the research in field of/ related to Women/ Feminism/ Gender questions/ issues conducted by Faculty Members, Research Scholars and Students of Mohanlal Sukhadia University.

This includes published/ presented papers, books, edited books, articles, research projects (completed/ ongoing), Ph.D. thesis and Dissertation etc. in both the (English and Hindi) languages. The bibliography is divided into sub categories like Research Papers, Books, Chapter in Books, Training Modules, Research Projects etc. and works are arranged alphabetically by author.

The Centre for Women's Studies is situated at College of Social Sciences and Humanities, M.L. Sukhadia University, Udaipur. It has been functioning since 1989.

OBJECTIVE :

The Centre is a multi disciplinary unit which studies women's issues from a holistic viewpoint involving all the disciplines of social sciences. Since women's studies belong to the humanistic traditions, the centre seeks to reach beyond merely academic concerns. It aims to create a consciousness of their role in the society and to promote awareness among themselves. Its reports are intended to be prescriptive and relevant for the formulators of public policy makers. Special efforts have been made to study problems of rural and tribal women belonging to deprived sections of society. Women's empowerment through equality is a thrust of this unit to develop self reliance about abilities and use them for their social & economic empowerment. The Centre has been organizing the following activities.

1. Diploma and Certificate course for upliftment and self reliance in women.
2. Awareness Camps to raise consciousness among tribal rural women.
3. Motivation for Research on women's themes striving to establish link between research, training and extension activities.
4. Awareness programmes with help of Audio video, literature poster and slogans etc.
5. Exchange of experiences and ideas through Extension lectures, discussions, seminars and workshop.
6. Documentation of material in the form of books, journals, monographs, reports, seminar papers, bibliographies, articles, press clippings etc.
7. It undertakes evaluations of several research projects and proposals and action and awareness training programme for different agencies as a part of consultancy services.

The Centre is functioning under the overall supervision and administrative control of the Dean, C.S.S H., M.L. Sukhadia University, Udaipur.

Activities Performed till date :

In its four major objectives of Teaching, Research, Extension and Documentation performed following activities.

1. Teaching :

2. Research :

The Faculty members of this University are under taking research project to explain the phenomenon of Women's Studies and to find out potentialities of women for economic Empowerment. A project entitled, "An Attitudinal study of value patterns, 'Adult literacy and Family Planning among the rural/tribal women has been sanctioned by the University which is under progress.

3. Documentation :

The Centre possesses good number of books related to women and Designing of Readymade Garments and other crafts for women. Efforts are being made to improve information process for researchers and faculty members by obtaining periodicals, reports and policy documents. The Centre is trying to establish contacts with National Information Centre at S.N.D.T. University Library at Bombay and other University.

4. Extension :

The Centre provides services to the society by equipping women with their own skill; one year certificate Course in designing and training of Ready made Garments supported by the State Government was started and two batches have already passed out. This unit of University is providing them placement in different garment making factories. Further, looking to the demand for the course, efforts are being made to upgrade it in to a Diploma Centre organizes different activities like Seminars, debates and other co-curricular activities to draw out the excellences in female gender. A workshop on Women's Entrepreneurship from the unorganized sector with the help of Districts Industry Centre, R. F. C. Banks and leading commercial organization was held at the centre. Participants registered for financial support from the bank and R.F.C. The model (The women owing their Industry) female shared their views with the participants. It was backed up with appropriate follow up measures.

Women' Day is celebrated on 8th March, On this day guest faculties, University faculties and students exchange their views. The students are maintaining "Women's Studies Club" to mobilize student community in order to give them awareness about the gender. The club has conducted a survey of Class-IV University Employees for adult literacy and encouraging them for future career. The Centre also provides counselling and guidance services to the female students of this University.
